PRETRIAL ORDER NO. 3050

AND NOW, this 1st day of October, 2003, it is hereby
ORDERED that Decision and Recommendation No. 98 of Special
Discovery Master (as to Various Motions in the Stringer Matter) is
AFFIRMED.

It is further ORDERED that:

(1) the alternative relief sought by Wyeth in its Emergency
Motion to Dismiss and for Sanctions (Doc. No. 203075) is GRANTED.
Plaintiff must undergo a psychological Independent Medical
Examination ("IME"). Further, Plaintiff is permitted to have a
personal representative present during the examination which will
not be videotaped. Further, the personal representative is
prohibited from speaking during the IME and must sit in an area
which will not interfere with the examination.


(2) the Plaintiff's Motion to Quash Subpoena (Doc. No. 203086) is DENIED IN PART AND GRANTED IN PART. Specifically, Wyeth's request for agreements or provisions for Dr. Taylor's compensation and Wyeth's request for charges by and/or payment to Dr. Taylor for services is GRANTED; Wyeth's request for Dr. Taylor's federal and state tax returns is DENIED; finally, Dr. Taylor shall supply Wyeth with the percentage of income over the past four years derived from the diet drug litigation.

(3) the Plaintiff's Motion to Compel (Doc. No. 203241) is DENIED;

(4) Wyeth's Cross-Motion to Compel (Doc. No. 203280) is GRANTED; and

(5) Plaintiff's Motion to Compel Payment of Medical Expenses Associated with IME (Doc. No. 203345) is DENIED as moot.
